COL Amara became Project Manager, Expeditionary Energy & Sustainment Systems in June 2023. In this role, she leads the Acquisition team charged with providing integrated, scalable, and affordable expeditionary energy, force sustainment, and contingency-basing capabilities that reduce Warfighter sustainment demand across the range of Joint operations. The PM is chartered as the Department of Defense Lead Standardization Activity responsible for providing a modernized family of mobile electric generator sets for all U.S. Armed Services. The team continues to expand its role in the Army as a lead integrator of operational energy solutions across multiple combat support systems.



COL Amara is a native of Liberty, New York, and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Quartermaster Corps in 1999.
